Contraindications:

- Hypersensitivity to Cannabinoids
- Cardiovascular Diseases including:
- Arrhythmia
- Heart failure (any kind)
- Poorly regulated Hypertension
- Ischemic heart disease
- History of Psychotic Disorders
- (Schizophrenia, Schizoaffective)

- (Sanizaphrenia, Sanizaphrective)
 Family History of Psychotic Disorders
 History of Drug Abuse
 Family history of Drug Abuse
 Males intending to start a family
 Children less than 18 years old Pregnant or breast feeding females

Serious Risks:

- Severe Psychiatric Side effects
- Psychosis
- Anxiety
- Mood Disorder CNS Depression
- Decreased Cognitive Performance
- Impairs Short Term Memory
- Impairs Attention, Coordination and Balance
- Impairs Judgment
- · Impairs motor skills.
- IMPAIRED DRIVING
- Tachycardia
- Drug Abuse Potential
- Hepatic Dysfunction Transaminitis

- Interactions:

 A CNS Depressants adverse effects are enchanced Anticholinergics increase tachycardia with marijuana
 Cocaine worsens tachycardia with marijuana

 - A Sympathomimetics can worsen tachycardia with marijuana
